Academic planning and standardized test preparation are integral parts of each year's programming. Beginning in 7th grade, all students are trained to use Naviance, the online counseling software, to support post-secondary planning.

Although students do not actually complete college applications until the fall of senior year, they should challenge themselves in courses and commit to activities of interest as early as possible.
