

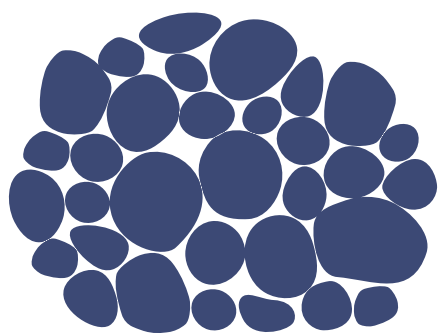

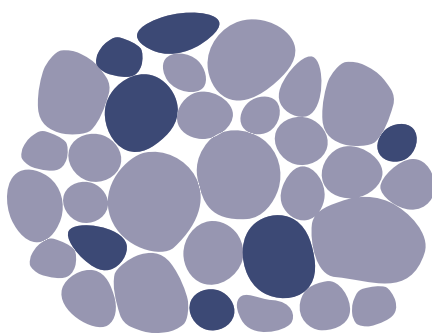


Laying the **groundwork...**

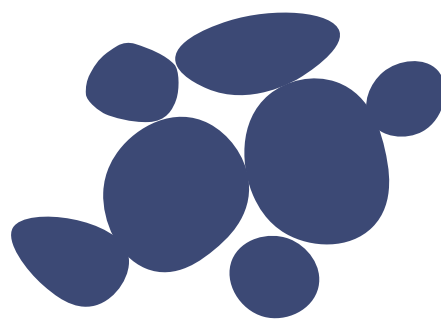
What makes a WHHS experience **unique**?

Students identify subjects and ideas that create an internal spark.



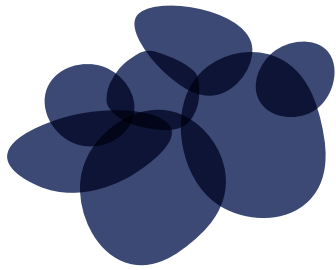
As students move forward, there is the opportunity to take deeper dives into subject areas of interest.

At Walnut Hills High School, success begins with a strong junior high foundation. Students are **introduced to our classical liberal arts curriculum**, where Math, English, Science, Social Studies, and three years of Latin carry equal importance. Fine Arts and Physical Education, including swimming, complete the curriculum.

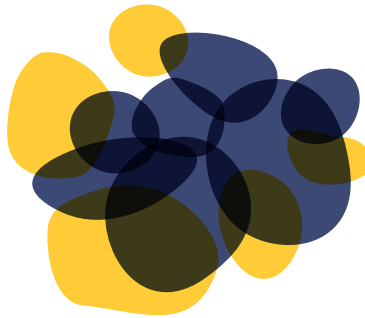
Students learn how to learn—developing note-taking, organization, time management, and goal-setting skills. They also learn to seek help and support systems. By building these habits early, students enter high school prepared to take on advanced coursework, explore interests, and grow into confident, capable learners.

Eighth grade continues the essential work of strengthening study habits while deepening core skills such as critical thinking, analysis, logic, and effective communication—tools that support lifelong learning and adaptability. Students develop greater self-awareness, recognizing the subjects and ideas that spark their curiosity. As their interests emerge, **students can confidently explore courses and extracurricular opportunities**, including clubs and activities that align with and nurture these growing passions.

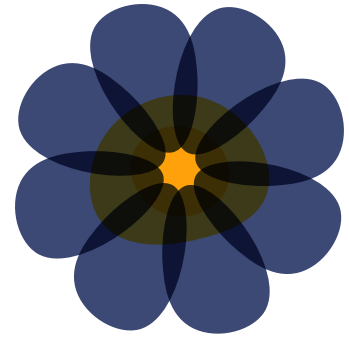
WHHS offers 35 Advanced Placement courses, the most rigorous classes available to high school students, designed to prepare them for the demands of college. An impressive 92% of WHHS students who take AP courses earn college credit. Students may also enroll in classes through **Ohio's College Credit Plus program**, including options taught on the WHHS campus—such as Multivariable Calculus, Engineering, Anatomy and Physiology—or at local colleges for subjects not offered in-house. WHHS upholds a long tradition of academic rigor while expanding electives like AP Human Geography, Cybersecurity, and AP Music Theory to reflect global trends.



Along the way, students are making connections between their classes, their lives, their peers and the world.



In tandem, students choose outside interests to layer in.



What emerges is a confidence to pursue interests and a drive to take action. This is the value of the WHHS experience.

In AP Comparative Government and Politics, students study six core countries—the United Kingdom, Russia, China, Mexico, Nigeria, and Iran—using a comparative, country-to-country approach. The course emphasizes methodology, civil society, institutional structures, democratization, and globalization, **helping students understand the global stage.**

As part of our History program, all 10th graders participate in a candidate or issue campaign. During our Candidate Fair, representatives across the political spectrum recruit student volunteers, offering **real-world insight into civic engagement and the democratic process.**

Walnut Hills offers 70+ student clubs and 90 athletic teams. It is here that students gain invaluable skills that shape their growth and identity. Clubs include Culinary, Astronomy, Journalism, Business, Cultural Clubs, Medical Explorers and Chess. A standout example is *Books for Kids*, where students write and illustrate personalized books for children facing medical challenges.

This year's Inaugural Club Leadership Conference brought students together to explore outward leadership and new ways to engage the WHHS community.



Athletics include traditional sports and more unique teams like archery, rugby, fencing, water polo, and Olympic weightlifting.

With layered interests both inside and outside of the classroom, **an individual awareness of the world emerges.** Students are learning not just from faculty, they are also learning from peers, from coaches, from teammates, from experiences and from exposure to places other than their home. They are developing the skills and confidence to observe, absorb, analyze, conclude and ultimately, act.



“To breathe clean air is a human right.” That belief inspired Walnut Hills seniors Audrey Symon and Sophie Krumm (Class of 2025) to take action—applying the leadership, critical thinking, writing, and research skills they’ve developed during their Walnut Hills education to protect that right for future generations.

The pair co-founded the Ohio Collaboration of Youth Climate Leaders (OCYCL), the school’s first environmental policy club, after meeting during their freshman year. Together, they joined the Citizens’ Climate Lobby Youth Challenge, a national effort encouraging students to advocate for renewable energy policies in their school districts.

Audrey and Sophie’s research and communication skills quickly became the foundation of a successful campaign. With their team, they analyzed data, wrote persuasive resolutions, and presented powerful public comments to the Cincinnati Public Schools (CPS) board. Their storytelling connected climate science to personal experience, emphasizing how poor air quality and urban heat affect local students.

“We realized that students can be powerful advocates when we use our skills and knowledge together,” said Audrey.


Their campaign gained momentum, gathering over 100 petition signatures. Within a year, CPS unanimously passed a clean energy resolution—the first in the nation achieved through the youth challenge. **The resolution has already led to \$12.6 million in EPA grants for 35 electric school buses, reducing pollution for thousands of students.**

Last year, the two leaders expanded their impact by earning a \$5,000 Seeds of Change Grant for the OCYCL Climate Advocates Project, delivering bilingual green-career materials to 24 CPS schools.

“Education gave us the tools,” Sophie said. “Now we’re using them to make real change.”



The Alumni Foundation recently put out a call for artists interested in enhancing our school facilities through student-created art. The response was enthusiastic—a small but passionate group of students showed up for the first meeting, eager to contribute their talents and creativity.

The group began brainstorming ideas for a project. They decided on a bold and meaningful challenge: painting a mural outside the Student Success Center (SSC).

Located on the first floor, the SSC serves primarily junior high students who may be at risk or struggling academically. The goal was to make the area more inviting, vibrant, and encouraging—a place that radiates warmth and hope. The center’s mission is to help students improve their academic performance, emotional well-being, and overall success at WHHS, so the mural needed to reflect that spirit.

A Real-World Art Experience

The Alumni Foundation approached the project as a “real-world” client experience. Students were tasked with developing and submitting three mural design proposals that met specific criteria:

- Reflect WHHS pride and community
- Be cheerful, bright, and joyful
- Inspire positivity and confidence

Each submission had to be professionally presented by a set deadline. The art faculty reviewed the entries, offered constructive feedback, and requested revisions before moving forward. Students also prepared budgets for supplies and a timeline for completion, mirroring the structure of real commissioned art projects.

Once the plans were approved, supplies were purchased, and work began right after the school year ended. Despite busy summer schedules, the students collaborated efficiently and managed to finish ahead of schedule, just before the fall semester started.

They handled every detail themselves—from washing and prepping the wall to daily cleanup. They not only honed their artistic skills but also essential life and career skills that will serve them well in any field they pursue. Their professionalism and teamwork were remarkable.

A Lasting Legacy

The finished mural now stands as a symbol of creativity, teamwork, and school spirit.

WHHS partnered with professors from Xavier University on a pilot project introducing students to the history of Evanston and King Records. The after-school program brought together participants from diverse backgrounds. Meeting twice a month, students learned to conduct oral history interviews with community members, which are now archived at the public library. They also worked with professionals to produce a podcast now available to the public.

Volunteer **Dylan Mosby '91** and faculty member **Ms. Samantha Stephenson** listened and mentored Philanthropy Club members as they researched local charities. **Students raised funds, evaluated organizations, and showcased how these charities strengthen our community**—from providing food and school supplies to helping young women afford prom dresses. These young Eagles embraced the chance to help others—and they truly soared.

Under the guidance of WHHS faculty members and with **support from Alumni and parent volunteers**, the WHHS Senior Theatre Troupe staged *The Unsinkable Molly Brown*. The production earned 26 Cappie Award nominations and seven awards at the 2025 Cappies of Greater Cincinnati.

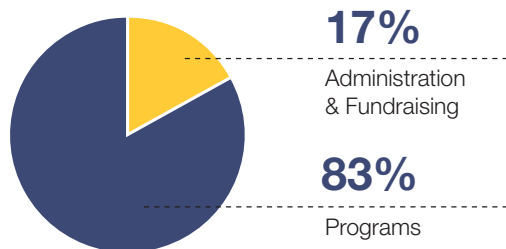
