 - News reporters use WHHS as the location to bring attention to the situation, but also brings angst and misinformation
 - Social media is also a space where misinformation is shared, we as parents need to convey the message about what we know is happening

Community Report

- Funding from COVID relief is millions of dollars and will allow us to have the new academic addition, lunchroom expansion, and tennis courts enclosure
- The majority is CARES Act money, but anything needed additional will be raised through the Alumni Association

- Long-Range Plan and Strategic Directions presented by Kathy Restle
 - Accreditation: a launchpad for school improvement, the personal trainer of schools, holds you accountable
 - Cognia
 - Series of name changes: North Central Association, AdvancEd, now Cognia
 - Engagement team review February 16-18, 2022 (postponed from last year)
 - Cognia is doing remote evaluations this year, but we have requested an in-person evaluation
 - Continuous Improvement Plan is our Long Range Plan, which needs to be endorsed by the LSDMC

 We have a Continuous Improvement Committee that meets monthly.

- Learning, Curriculum, AP classes, Support Services, Marketing, etc...
- We wanted to really focus on the next big transformational plans for our school, what is the next Big Idea?
 - Many ideas were provided and input from departments and committee members
 - The Long Range Plan has been approved by the ILT
- Establish ourselves as a Regional Center for Innovative Practices
 - Provide AP Traning at Walnut, using Walnut teachers to support the training
 - Community Learning Center
 - ESL Instruction, Technology Instruction, adult literacy

- Explore the scheduling and use instructional time to maximize the Walnut Hills High School experience
- Classical Education
 - Continue to be intentional in how programming and curricular connections relate to a global citizenship based on a foundation of timeless principles.
 - Students are equipped to engage in dialogue, conversational and presentational skills to communicate and participate in a global citizenship.

 - All members of the faculty are asked to participate
 - Next meeting November 10, 2021

- Distinguished Scholar Update from last school year. How did it go?
 Feedback? Anything for LSDMC to do?
 - This past year it was hard to put a new process in place when not all students were back on campus
 - We reached out to (Cum Laude eligible students)prior to Spring Break and had them fill out the application prior to the Cum Laude tapping, which notified some students earlier than others that they had achieved Cum Laude
 - It should be more smooth this year
 - The Distinguished Scholar for the class of 2021 was one of the top 10 students, but not the first student in the class
 - Saundra Oprea: Is it out of the question to add an additional speaker for those that are not at the top academically?
 - Terrence Poole: We need to hold fast to our current criteria for Distinguished Scholar for at least the next couple of years, but it's not out of the question to revisit the criteria in the future
 - John Chambers: We talked about this for a long while and decided that academic rigor and achievement was important for the Distinguished Scholar speaker
 - Julia Berman: Advocate to keep it academic-based
 - John Chambers: The senior class is a high-achieving group of students. The Distinguished Scholar is not the only speaker at graduation, but also the Student Congress President and Senior Class President, both nominated by their peers
